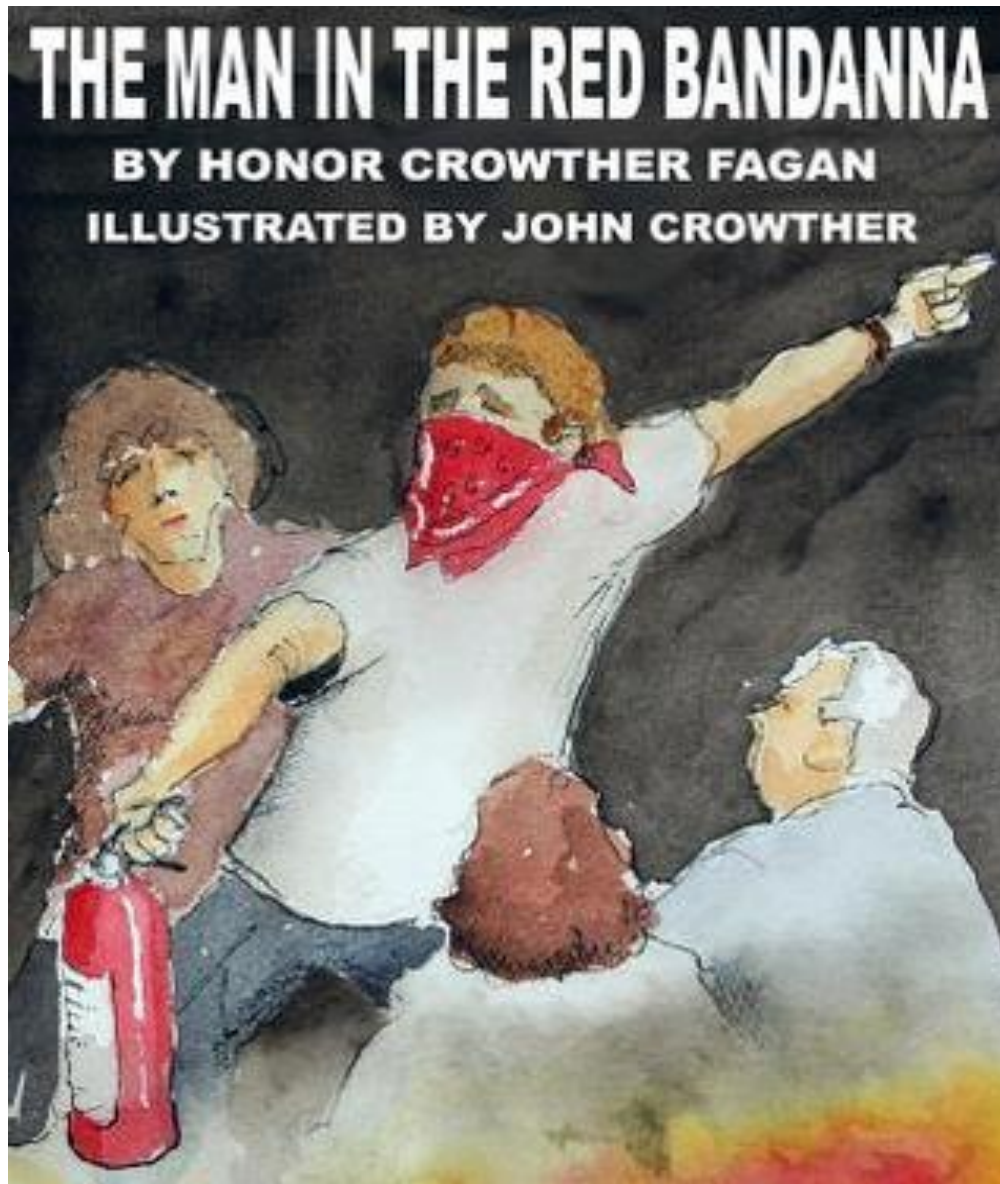

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Engage: Hook the students	<p>Explain to students, on September 11, 2001, four airplanes were hijacked, or taken over, by 19 terrorists and flown into important buildings in the United States. Two planes were flown into the Twin Towers in New York City. One plane was flown into the Pentagon in Washington DC, and the fourth plane crashed in Shanksville, PA. As people rushed out of the Twin Towers, many people rushed in to help, including firefighters and police officers, who saved thousands of lives. Almost 3,000 people were killed by the terrorist on 9/11, 2,750 died in the Twin Towers, 186 people died in the Pentagon, 40 people died in PA. Included in those numbers are 441 first responders who died trying to help other people to safety.</p> <p>Play the Read Aloud Book, <i>The Man in the Red Bandana</i>, Author-Honor Crowther Fagan; Illustrator-John Crowther https://youtu.be/1Gi-vFqeHr8</p> <p>Think/Pair/Share Activity-Pair the students with a partner. Explain the T/P/S directions. The students will think of their answer, get with their partner, and share their answer.</p> <p>T/P/S Question: What makes a person a hero?</p> <p>Brainstorm: Ways to show gratitude to heroes in your local communities.</p>
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Explore: Students make sense of a concept through observations.	<p>Students will complete <i>The Man in the Red Bandana</i> Story Analysis Worksheet.</p> <p>Students will color the red bandana on the back of the Patriot Day Thank You card and write a Thank You note inside of the card to a First Responder in their local community.</p> <p>Students will complete the My Patriot Day Flip Book.</p> <p>Students will complete the Patriot Day Word Search Puzzle.</p>
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Explain: Teacher introduces formal vocabulary and language to students.	<p>hijacked Pentagon gratitude</p> <p>terrorists First Responders</p> <p>Twin Towers heroes</p>
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Elaborate: Students apply what they have learned.	<p>Students will learn about Patriot Day and the heroes who helped others on September 11, 2001, by completing the Man in the Red Bandana Story Analysis, completing the Patriot Day flip book and writing thank you letters to those who serve their communities.</p>
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Evaluate: assessment.	<p>Teachers should choose which activities to use as formal/informal assessments.</p>
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Enrichment/Service-Learning Project	<p>Student will write Thank You cards to First Responders in their local community. Students will brainstorm other ways to show their gratitude to those who serve in their community.</p>
